**Industrial Extension Is Beginning**

North Carolina's industrial economy will soon get the same statewide extension service that its agriculture has had for the past 56 years.

The moment marking its beginning was 2 P. M. on Thursday, April 7, in a little noticed ceremony in the State Capitol.

At that hour Gov. Dan K. Moore, State Director of Administration Ed Rankin and the State's Economic Coordinator Wayne Corpening met in the State Capitol with 33 industrial and education leaders.

They launched the State Technical Services program in North Carolina. Despite its somewhat nondescript title, it's an industrial extension service with a long-range powerful boost for industry.

North Carolina State University will play a central role in carrying it out in the same way that it has in agricultural extension for a half century.

Just as North Carolina was among the first in agricultural extension (it started in 1909 well before the federal government provided for a nationwide program in 1914), so is North Carolina among the first with a formal industrial extension program.

The state established a small unit at N. C. State University in 1955. Ten years later, in 1965, the federal government passed the national State Technical Services Act—the umbrella for the program Gov. Moore has now launched.

The new extension program will aid "the econo-

mic development of North Carolina and the employment of its people through the wide dissemination and application of science and technology in business, commerce and industry."

It will be administered through the N. C. Department of Administration and will involve major divisions of the University of North Carolina, other educational institutions, the Department of Conservation and Development, the Research Triangle Institute, the North Carolina Board of Science and Technology, the State Economic Coordinator and other state offices and agencies.

Plans for the new program were developed at the request of Rankin by University of North Carolina officials.

**Work Begins Immediately**

An immediate one-year plan and a five-year plan were outlined.

Work will begin immediately on a number of technical services projects:

1. A technical information center will be established at N. C. State University to "make scientific and technical knowledge available to the commerce and industry of the state."

2. N. C. State's Industrial Extension Service and Mineral Industries Laboratory, working with the N. C. Board of Science and Technology and the Department of Conservation and Development, will develop a "profile of industry needs and interests" in scientific and technological information.

3. An analytical project to interpret the profile information will be established to provide a "guide for future technical service plans in relation to the economic welfare (and goals) of North Carolina industry."

4. The "breadth and depth" of the current Industrial Extension Service and Mineral Industries Laboratory will be extended through a three-phase industrial liaison activity. A concentrated effort will be made to acquaint industries with the technical services work, to provide them with technical information and to provide feedback information for other service projects.

5. An organized series of educational television programs will be prepared for updating engineers and plant managers. ETV courses in business management science and industrial statistics will also be established.

6. The Industrial Extension Service will expand its training aids library, develop seminars for industrial development with the N. C. Area Development Association, establish conferences on the availability and utilization of mineral resources and conduct pilot studies with educational television as a means of communicating technical information.

**Five-Year Program**

The five-year-plan provides for expanded and new technical services for all areas of North Carolina's industrial activity. It includes work by the Industrial Extension Service, the Schools of Textiles and Forestry, and the Department of Food Science at N. C. State; the N. C. Board of Science and Technology; the Research Triangle Institute; the Bureau of Business Services and Research at the University at Chapel Hill, and coordinated work by all of the existing agencies of state government and higher education, including the Department of Conservation and Development, the State Economic Coordinator; the Board of Higher Education; the Department of Administration, and the State Planning Committee.

The overall program will operate with a Governor's Advisory Council (the 33 who met with him at the Capitol); an executive committee from the University, state agencies and industry; and a director who will be located at North Carolina State.

If the success of the agricultural extension service is any measure, the future for the technical extension service seems equally promising.

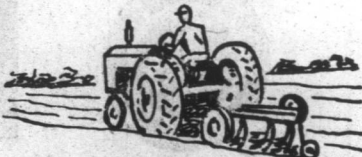

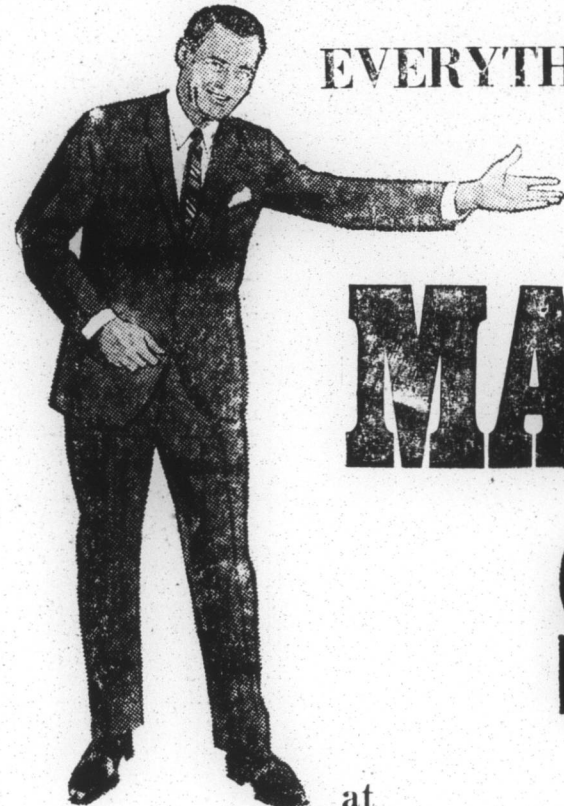
