The newspaper publication for Chowan High School, which is titled the Chowan-Herald, has recently been awarded the official rating of first place as released by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association of Columbia University in the city of New York.

The first place certificate signifies first place rating in the mimeograph media on a nationwide basis. The issues that were analyzed by the C. S. P. A. board of judges were the 1965 issues edited by Mary Ellen Ober, editor-in-chief, and associate editor, Joyce Byrum and also the 1965 issues through December 15, edited by Margaret Tynch, editor-in-chief, and Gloria Byrum, associate editor.

Headlines (complete statements used proper and verb tense and voice). 3. Copyreading and editing, evidence of consistency in style. 4. Proof-reading, evidence of attention given to mechanical detail. D. Makeup: Editorial page masthead appropriately placed and condensed pertinent data included.

Other pages. 1. Lists and data properly paraphrased or boxed. 2. Headlines (arrangement, effort made to avoid cluttering and jamming of headlines).

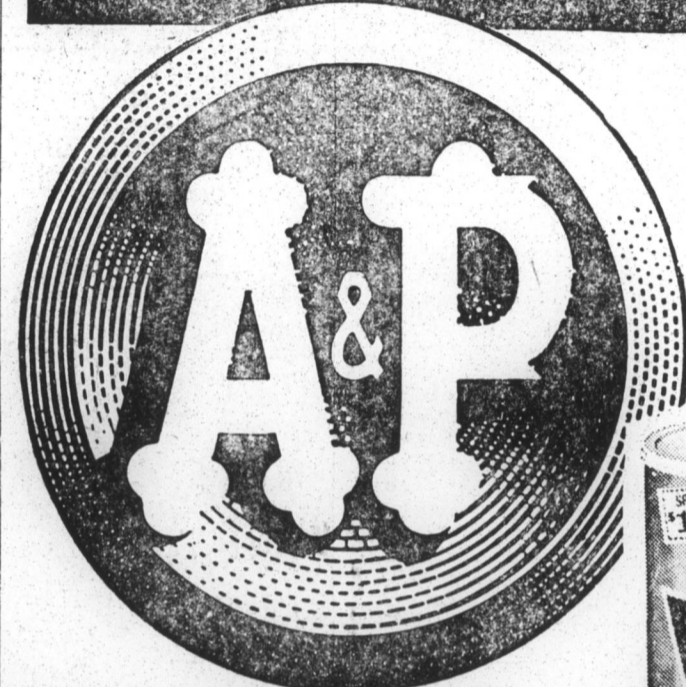

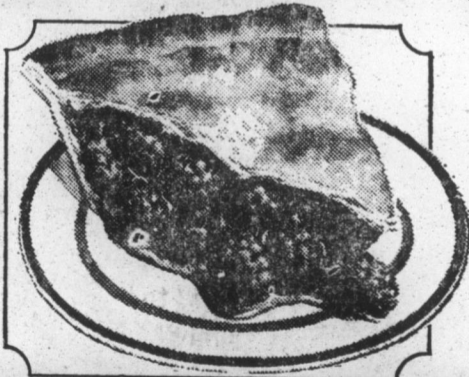
