Last week one of the closest votes of this present session of Congress occurred while the House was considering the Independent Offices Appropriations Act. The House Appropriations Committee had refused to continue the rent subsidy program, but on the floor of the House, an amendment was sent forward to restore the \$20 million appropriation for this purpose. Many of us felt that this was not economically sound and by no stretch of the imagination would it ultimately help the low income citizens. So all of the Democratic delegation from North Carolina

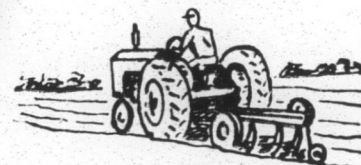

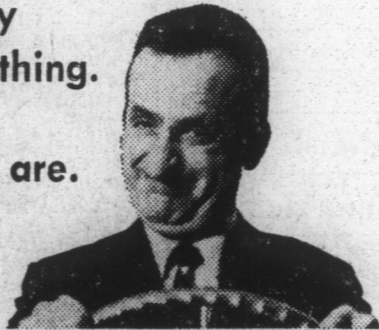

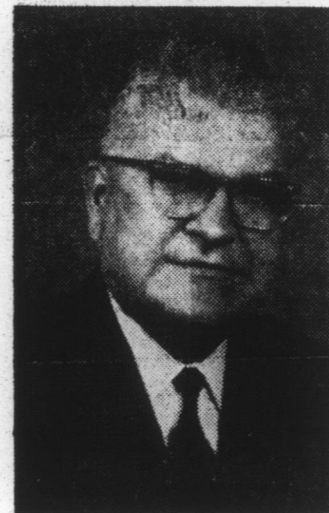
