

Veterans' Corner

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans' benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q. I receive dependency and indemnity compensation based upon my husband's death in service. He earlier held a higher grade for eight

months in World War II. Shouldn't my rate be based upon the higher grade?
A. Yes. This is provided by a new law effective December 1, 1966. Information is not available to identify such cases as yours, so you should write the VA about this. It will not be automatic. New cases after December 1, 1966, will be automatically adjusted.

Grant Available For Librarians

Carroll Powell, library supervisor of Fayetteville City Schools and chairman of the North Carolina Association of School Librarians, announced that a scholarship for school librarians is being made available by the North Carolina Association of School Librarians, a section of the North Carolina Library Association.

The scholarship, for the amount of \$350, shall be awarded each year to an applicant who already holds an undergraduate degree but who wishes to certify or do graduate work in library science and be a school librarian. The aim of the scholarship is to encourage entrance into the field of school librarianship or advancement for those already members of the profession.

Applications may be obtained from each county and city superintendent or from the scholarship committee chairman, Mrs. Elizabeth S. Storie, Box 867, Statesville, N. C. 28677. Deadline for the applications is March 15.

Q. I receive \$125 a month for training under the GI Bill. My wife and I expect our first child soon. What must I do to receive the \$150 rate of training allowance?
A. Notify the VA as soon as the baby is born. The VA will need a copy of the birth certificate, but if there is to be any delay in getting this, send a notice of the birth to establish the effective date of your claim for increase.

Q. Do I have to report as income the interest earned on my Series E Bonds when I complete the annual income questionnaire?
A. Not if you don't cash the bonds. Interest earned should be reported only for the calendar year in which the bonds are cashed.

Q. I have just been discharged from the Army. I served four years. Can I get a GI home loan and go to school under the new GI Bill at the same time?
A. Generally, yes. You should contact your nearest Veterans Administration regional office.

Q. Is a six-month reservist eligible for training under PL 89-358?
A. No, since this was duty for training purposes only.

Q. I receive a widow's pension. I was not working when I began receiving the pension, but I have now secured employment. Is it necessary to report this to VA, or may I wait until I receive an income questionnaire at the end of the year?
A. You should inform the VA at once so that your continued entitlement may be checked. This could prevent the creation of an overpayment, which would later have to be repaid to the VA.
