County Agent Role Changing: The following is a reprint from material recently received: "The county agent, an institution of rural America for more than a half century, is swinging with the times. "Without neglecting his original client and old friend, the farmer, the extension agent has taken on a whole new field of services to keep up with the sprawl of cities into the countryside. In areas turning urban, the agents—called from advisers in some states—are helping housewives knock out rose aphids, subdividers study soil maps and communities set up recreation programs. "The shift in duties is in line with Congress; original intention that the extension service, an early and highly successful experiment in federal-state cooperation, would serve

all the people. "Despite the drastic decline in the number of farmers, reports Dr. Lloyd Davis, head of extension in the U. S. Department of Agriculture, the nation still has 11,000 county extension workers, about the same as 10 years ago. With supervisors, administrators and college specialists, the total is 14,000. At least half still are doing some agricultural work. "The program costs some \$200 million a year, of which Congress appropriates 33 per cent. A similar portion comes from the states and the rest from county and other local sources. This arrangement explains the label 'Cooperative Extension.' "Why an army of field workers in this day of fast communications? No one has found a satisfactory replacement for the personal

link between researcher and layman than the extension agent. Indeed, the system is so successful that it has been copied by foreign countries as they upgrade their agriculture. It is considered a key to the improvement of underdeveloped countries. "The movement to help America's rural people actually goes back to President Lincoln's signing of the Land Grant College Bill more than a century ago. States were allotted public lands on the basis of 30,000 acres per member of Congress. Proceeds of the sales of the lands went to establish agricultural colleges, and farm research was born." **Lamb Pool:** A cooperative marketing lamb pool has been scheduled to be held at the Eastern North Carolina Livestock Arena at Rocky Mount on Tues-

day, June 27. Lambs should arrive between 7 and 10 A. M. The best market weight for lambs is from 85 to 100 pounds. If there are some sheep growers in this area who have not sold their lambs, this sale offers a good opportunity. Growers should take their wool sale slips and their lamb sale slips to the county ASCS office and sign their application for the government incentive payment on wool. By doing this as soon as wool and lambs are sold, it will not be overlooked and in the course of time the incentive payment check will come. **Rain And Cultivation:** At long last we have been blessed with a 1.3 inch rain, according to my unofficial rain gauge. I am sure that all of us are happy to get this moisture for our crops. Rain will soon be followed by cultivation. Make these cultivations as shallow as possible to control grass and weeds only. Shallow cultivation releases a minimum amount of moisture, and will get the grass and weeds as well as deep cultivation although it may be necessary a

little more often, and will not disturb or destroy root systems which are so necessary for maximum plant performance. In applying side dressings of fertilizer materials, remember that the roots reach just as far as the plant is tall or as far as the vines grow in length. Top dressing should be placed a good distance from the plants to avoid plant injury and the roots will get it just the same.

Honor Is Voted To Rep. Jones

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Rep. Walter B. Jones is the recipient of the Distinguished Service Award of the non-partisan Americans for Constitutional Action (ACA). The award is made every two years to members of the Congress who are judged by ACA to be supporting legislation which will strengthen and defend the Constitution of the United States. Rep. Jones, in the words of ACA trustees chairman, Admiral Ben Moreel, has an "outstanding record in Congress and devotion to those fundamental principles of good government which serve to promote in-

dividual rights and responsibilities, a sound dollar, a growing economy and a desire for victory over communist aggression." The admiral added that Jones' award does not necessarily mean that the congressman has to agree completely with ACA principles and policies. "Our sole purpose in this," he said, "is to honor Rep. Jones for his dedication to the Constitution." Rep. Jones is now serving his first full term in the House of Representatives. His committee assignments include Agriculture and Merchant Marine and Fisheries.

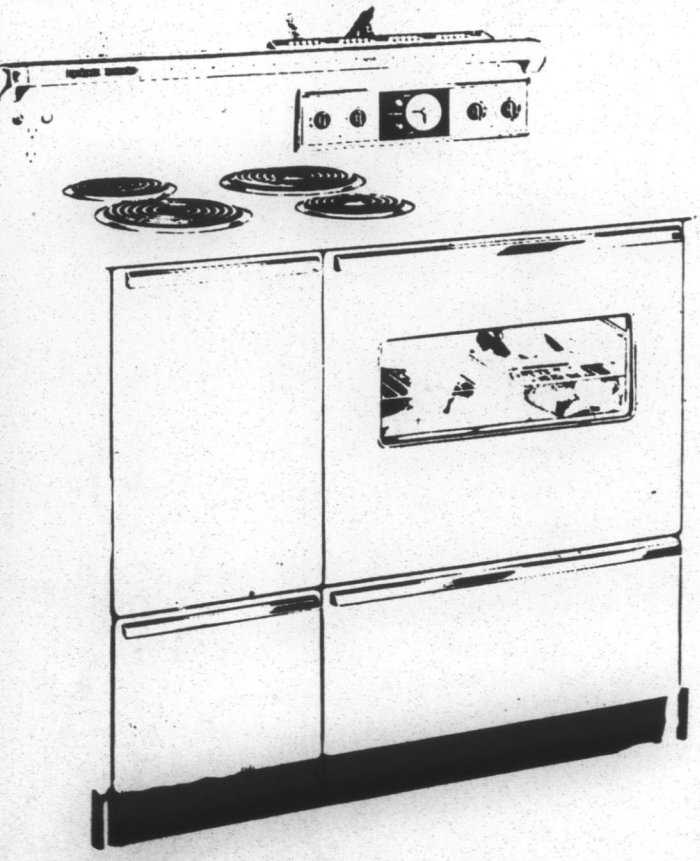
