Edenton, N. C., November 7, 1967. The Board of Public Works met this day in regular session at 8 P. M. at the Edenton Municipal Building.

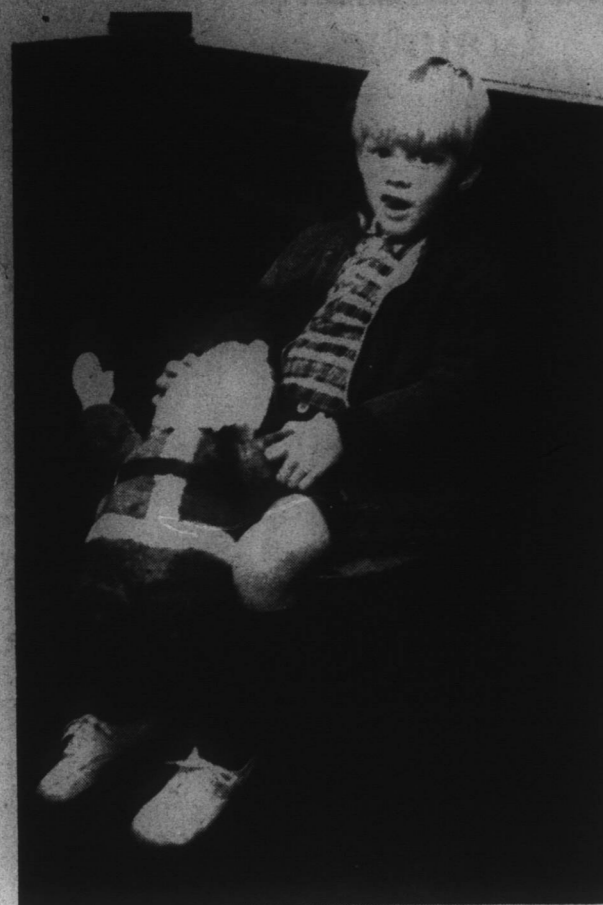

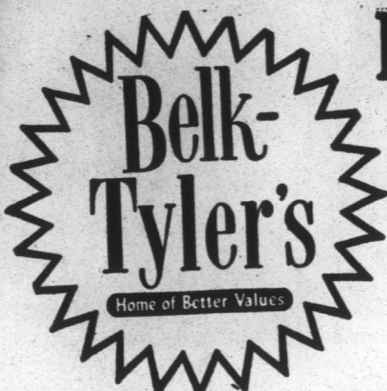
