Creative Crafts: The general widespread interest in creative crafts is shared by many citizens in Chowan County. A canning workshop for adults and copper tooling workshops for the youth were featured ac-

tivities this year. Two Chowan County women taught classes at District Crafts Workshop and three demonstrated at the Albemarle Craftsman's Fair. One woman had her hand-made hammocks on exhibit at the Smithsonian Institute during the month of October.

Community Development: Organized community development offers an opportunity for both the family and community improvement. When a community program is carefully planned and a plan of action followed, success is inevitable.

There are 22 recognized rural communities in Chowan County. Twelve of these were working on an organized basis during 1967. There are duplications of community organizations in the same geographic boundaries which needs to be simplified as much as possible. Other community organization and development work has been conducted by community action workers under the Economic Improvement Council, the representative agency for the Office of Economic Opportunity for the 10-county Albemarle area. Extension has also worked with these workers and assisted with supervising these and other programs sponsored by the Economic Improvement Council.

engaged in community development work in 1967 were: Rocky Hock, which was the winning community in Chowan County and competed on the ten-county area level; Center Hill (2); Gliden; Hudson Grove; Mexico Road; Oak Grove; Paradise Road; Ryland; St. John and Warren Grove-Green Hall. Of the varied community projects carried out by the communities, some of the outstanding projects included: improving community buildings, such as building kitchen facilities for serving community groups and raising funds for other activities; providing summer recreation for youth, and sponsoring other youth activities; working toward securing a sanitary water supply in the community; beautifying the community buildings, and paying for community buildings recently constructed or purchased.

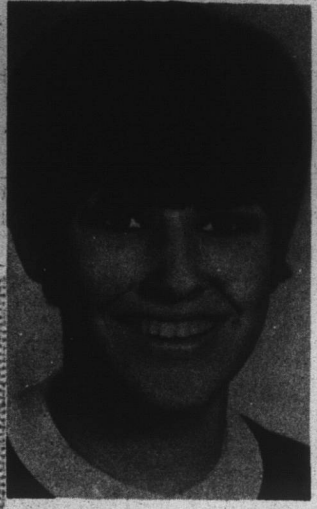
A luncheon was held for the students, parents, school officials and others. Jim James of Union Camp Corporation made a very interesting talk on conservation for the students after which the prizes were presented.
