Hospital Rates To Be Increased

RALEIGH — The State Board of Mental Health has approved an increase in fees for patients in the four state psychiatric hospitals and the state-operated alcoholic rehabilitation center at Butner from \$4 to \$7 a day, effective July 1.

An increase from \$2 to \$3.50 per day was approved for the state retardation centers and from \$2.50 to \$3.50 per day for treatment at Wright School for emotionally disturbed children in Durham.

According to Bill Johnston, reimbursement officer for the State Department of Mental Health, the reason that fees in the retardation centers are lower is because the period of hospitalization in these facilities often runs into many years.

Johnston said the raise in rates is necessary to keep pace with rising costs of operating the state facilities.
