**DR. M. W. NESBITT
Duke Position To Dr. Nesbitt**

CHARLOTTE—The appointment of Dr. M. Wilson Nesbitt of Durham as director of Rural Church Affairs and secretary of the Rural Church Committee of The Duke Endowment is announced by Thomas L. Perkins, chairman of the trustees of the endowment. The addition of Dr. Nesbitt as a full-time staff member is a major step in reorganizing operation of the rural church program to bring the two conferences of the United Methodist Church in North Carolina and their bishops into closer contact with the program, Perkins said. Dr. Nesbitt will represent the trustees in dealing with the conferences, with the Divinity School at Duke University, with the Bishops' Advisory Committee on the Rural Church, and with other agencies concerned with rural churches. His headquarters will be in the Durham office of The Duke Endowment.

For the last 10 years Dr. Nesbitt has been associate professor of the work of the rural church at the Divinity School and director of rural church work under the endowment. Rural Methodist churches in North Carolina are one of the four major beneficiaries of the endowment. It provides funds for building, operation and maintenance of such churches, and to help in the support of Methodist ministers retired from one of the conferences and of widows and dependent ministers who died while serving one of them.

Dean R. E. Cushman of the Divinity School expressed regret at Dr. Nesbitt's separation from immediate relationship with the faculty and administrative program but said he recognizes the larger contribution which his experience and understanding will be able to bring to the plans of the rural church program of the endowment.

It is one thing to believe in something. It is quite another to advocate the violation of one's oath of office in order to satisfy one's prejudices or gain popularity or further one's own business interests.

Regardless of how we feel about it personally, the law says that segregation is illegal. It also says that dual school systems must be eliminated by 1969-70. We have been given a one year extension due to our projected building program.

Also the Supreme Court has recently ruled that "Freedom of Choice is not an end in itself. If it fails to undo segregation, other means must be used to achieve this end."

Certainly, all of the school board members have a copy of this ruling. If the editor does not have a copy, I will be glad to see that he gets one.

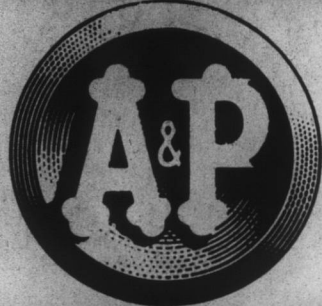
