

## Youth Barnyard Slated At Fair

RALEIGH—Ponies, rabbits and purples—all within petting distance—will be three of the many barnyard animals on display in the "Children's Barnyard" at this year's North Carolina State Fair October 14-19.

The barnyard, a rousing success during its two years at the fair, will introduce a new feature this year. Many of the animals will be displayed so children may pet them while touring the exhibit. All animals will be tame.

The display also will include geese, ducks, mules, cattle, turkeys, hogs, sheep, goats, pigeons, chickens,

guineas, dairy cows, horses and kittens. Many pens will include young as well as mature specimens.

Sponsored by Wake County Future Farmers of America, the barnyard will be relocated in a tent adjacent to the Viet Nam Village.

FFA members will be in the barnyard each day to tend the animals and answer questions from children.

Each animal will be identified with a card attached to its pen. Feeding times will be announced so children may watch. No admission fee will be charged.

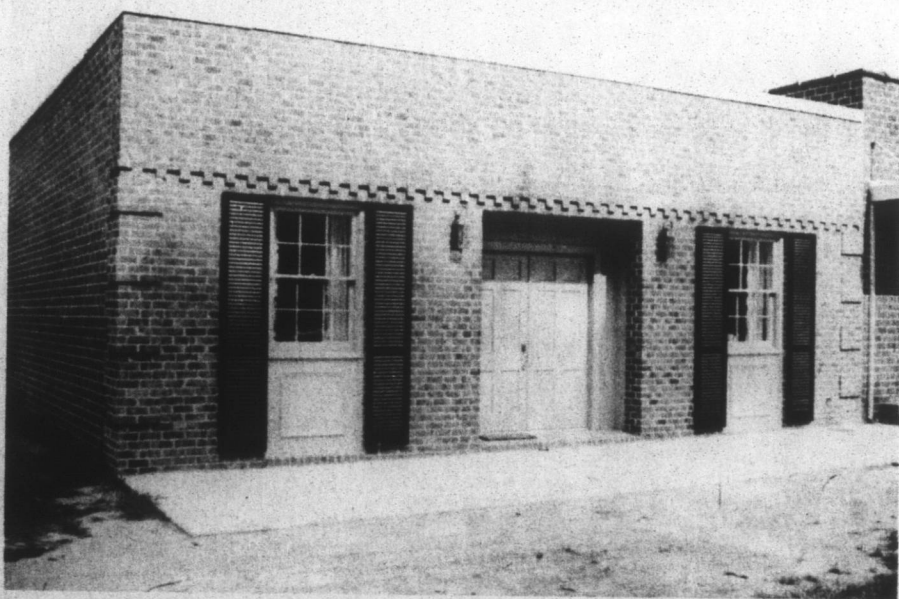
We all have dreams and ideals, and they were not easily obtained. Usually when we destroy these ideals and dreams, we end up breaking our own hearts.
