Land Forming Demonstration: Land forming is something new for our area. On Thursday of next week, May 15, a land forming demonstration will be held with Preston Monds on the Bennie P. Monds farm adjoining the highway in Bear Swamp near Center Hill.

The field is located beside the Bennie Monds home. The event is scheduled for 10 o'clock Thursday morning. It will be repeated in the afternoon at 2 o'clock. Attend the time most convenient for you.

The event is being conducted by the Soil Conservation Service, N. C. State University and the Agricultural Extension Service cooperating. Equipment is being furnished by various cooperating equipment companies. Mr. Monds is furnishing the necessary tractors.

Land forming has several benefits. Potholes or low places in fields can be eliminated. Fields can be shaped for adequate sur-

face drainage. Properly shaped fields afford an opportunity for surface or furrow irrigation. The advantages will be explained at the demonstrations.

I realize that this is a busy time. But a couple of hours spent in attending this demonstration will not make much difference in your operation. You may learn something that will be helpful on your farm. Anyway, it will be interesting and educational.

Remember the time, Thursday, May 15, at 10 o'clock and repeated that afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Cotton Planting. I have had several calls relative to the rate of planting cotton seed. Here is the answer:

Put your planters on hard ground where the seed can be found and counted. Drive the planters at the same speed as when planting in the field. After seed are dropped mark off a 10-foot space and count the seed.

If the seed germination is 90 per cent or better, you should have 60 to 80 seed

in the 10-foot space. If the seed germination is between 80 and 90 per cent, you should have 80 to 100 seed in the 10-foot space.

If seed germination is below 80 per cent, increase the seeding rate accordingly.

At the best, all seed will not come up and all that come up will not live and do well. You want to end

up with a good growing stand averaging three to four plants per foot of row.

Peanut Planting. Now the weather is good and generally the soil is right. Plant peanuts immediately for highest yields and best quality. Follow the good peanut practices. When you need our help or information, call us.
