A letter from James C. Dail, executive vice president of Edenton Savings & Loan Association, was read requesting county deposits. It was agreed that when some investments are available or overlapping funds in the banks that an investment be made in Edenton Savings & Loan Association.

On motion of David T. Bateman, seconded by C. A. Phillips and duly carried that C. W. Overman be allowed to purchase table and chairs and house planning slides in the approximate amount of \$249.50 plus freight.

Motion of C. A. Phillips, seconded by J. Clarence Leary and unanimously carried that Sheriff be relieved of Western Union tax of 93c.

Motion by J. Clarence Leary, seconded by David T. Bateman and unanimously carried that American Legion be granted permission to sponsor the County Fair tax free, also display fireworks under proper supervision.

Motion by C. A. Phillips, seconded by David T. Bateman and unanimously carried that the decision of the employment of the auditor for county records was left to the judgment of the chairman.

Motion made by C. A. Phillips, seconded by J. Clarence Leary and duly

carried charging \$40.43 to the sheriff.

Notices to apply for a beer permit were approved for Billie Ray Lassiter, trade name B & H Service Center and E. J. Boyce, Jr., Broad Street Service Station.

Ernest P. Kehayes and Mrs. Rose Pugh, representing Alcoholism and Mental Health Center, appeared before the Board requesting additional amount of money in 1969-70 budget to carry out necessary work in the amount of \$2,345.80.

On motion of J. Clarence Leary, seconded by C. A. Phillips and unanimously carried agreeing to go on record in support of the optional one-cent sales tax to be distributed to the county.

W. O. Lambeth with the Soil Conservation Service, and Frank McGoogan, soil conservation technician, appeared before the Commissioners and explained the soil conservation program. They expressed their appreciation to the Board for and unanimously carried their cooperation in the water survey program, also carried agreeing to go on record in support of the Soil Conservation Service.

A motion was made by David T. Bateman, seconded by J. Clarence Leary

that a letter be written to the State Conservator stating their interest in soil survey for Chowan County and would like the state office's committee to come and estimate the cost of participation in this project and the SCS will pay.

The following reports were accepted and ordered filed:

Sheriff; Edenton Fire Department; Coroner; County Accountant; County Welfare Officer; Welfare Department; County Extension chairman.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

GROWN-UPS

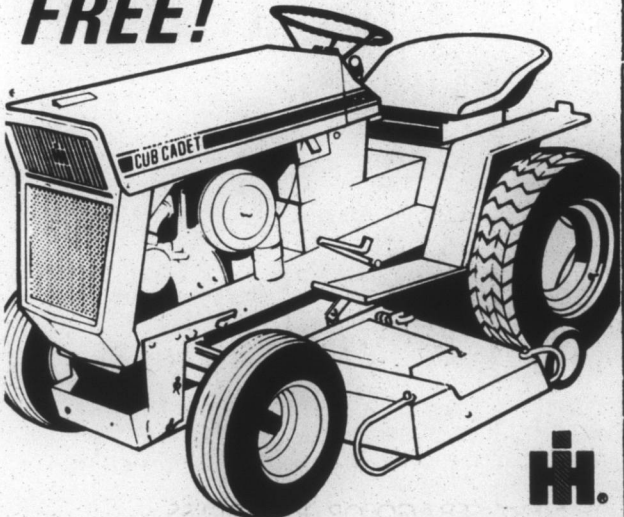

Is rewarded for this stunt.

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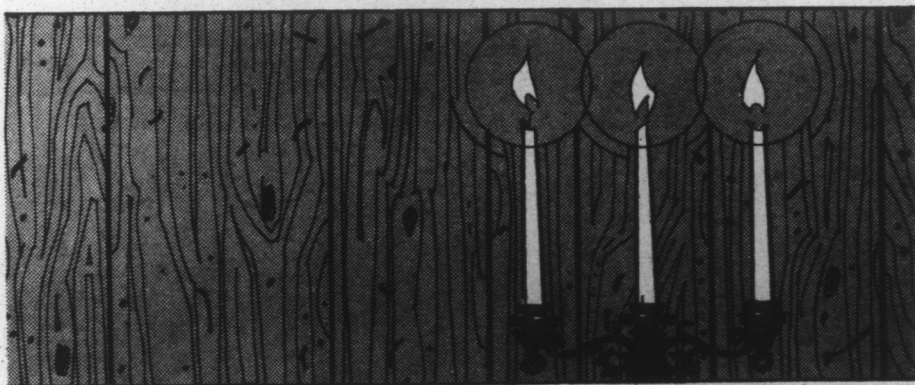


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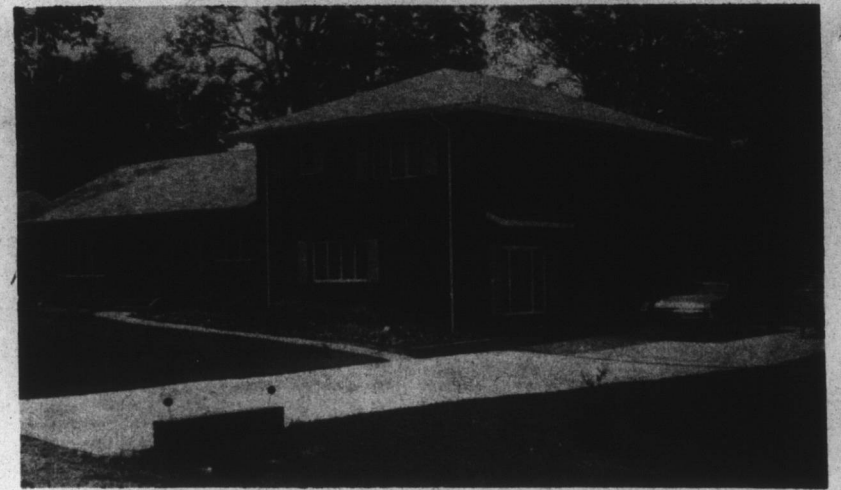
