water and applesauce. Beat two minutes at medium speed. Add eggs and beat two minutes longer. Blend in raisins and nuts. Turn into a greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake in 350-degree oven one hour and 15 minutes or until cake tests done. Cool in pan 15 minutes. Turn out and cool completely.

Frosting

2 egg whites.
1½ cups sugar.
½ teaspoon cream of tartar.
½ cup orange juice.
1 teaspoon vanilla.

Place all ingredients in top of double boiler, over boiling water. Beat with electric mixer at high speed for five to seven minutes or until mixture stands in peaks. Measure one-half cup of frosting into small bowl; add few drops of green food coloring. Tint remaining frosting orange. Now turn the cake into a pumpkin. With a sharp knife, round off top edge of cake by cutting off small amount of cake all the way around. Place cake on serving plate. Stand a banana in center to make the stem; cut off enough from one end to make the other end extend about two inches above top of cake. Frost cake with orange-tinted frosting. To make ridges, lightly draw spatula from bottom of top of cake. To make stem, frost top of banana with green frosting.

Witches' Brew

½ cup sugar.
½ teaspoon cinnamon.
½ teaspoon allspice.
½ teaspoon nutmeg.
1 quart cider, divided.
1 can (8 oz.) frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed.
2 cups gingerale, chilled.
Orange slices.
Mix sugar, cinnamon, allspice and nutmeg in saucepan; add one cup of cider and heat until sugar dissolves. Add remaining cider and orange juice concentrate, chill. Just before serving, stir in gingerale. Garnish with orange slices decorated with candy or cloves to make pumpkin faces. Makes seven cups.

Pvt. Stallings is the son of Mrs. Mary Drgain, Route 3, Edenton.

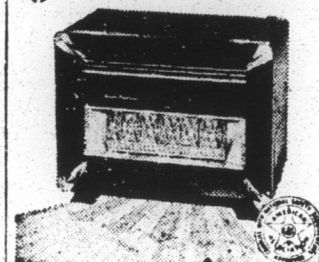
