## Most Military Services Are Now Using Social Security Numbers

can't rattle off your sosecurity number with nty? You probably will able to soon if you're ded for the armed forces. It's name, rank, and social ecurity number now.

Since last summer, most military services have used social security numbers rather than serial numbers for new inductees. This is quite appropriate since young people erving in the armed forces build up valuable financial protection under social security for themselves and their families.

As a matter of fact, members of the armed forces get a special break on social security. Not only does the Government match their contributions, as a private employer does, but servicemen now get a \$100 a month "bonus" credit to cover noncash pay they receive, such as room and board and clothing allowance. They pay no contributions on this bonus

Young men who have completed their military service generally have built up enough social security credit

Are you one of the mil-ns of young men or women themselves and their families if they die or become disabled —even before they start their civilian careers. The families of most would still be eligible for social security survivors benefits even though the veteran attended 4 years or more of college before going to

For example, take the case of a young man who enters the service at age 19 and completes 2 years of service. His family would be eligible to receive social security checks if he died before the age of 30. He would also be eligible for monthly disability checks for himself and his family if he became disabled before age 24.

Moreover, many wounded Vietnam veterans receive monthly social security disability checks, and the widows and children of many deceased servicemen are getting monthly checks based on the social security credits their husbands earned in the service.

A lot of people think of social security as just for senior citizens. But it's important to our younger citi-


