A Singing Flame May End Air Jets' Whine

A "Singing Flame" may put an end to the whining sound of the airplane jet engine, if the experiments are successful at the College of Engineering, Pennsylvania State University.

Mechanical engineer Gerhard Reethof is searching for an efficient, economical method of reducing the loud whine of fan-jet engines.

His premise is that, if a pure tone could be generated in a jet engine's hot exhaust gases and if that sound could be pitched exactly out of phase with the fan-blade noise, the two will cancel. Preliminary research has shown that an oscillating electric field acting on the boundary of the hot part of an oxy-acetylene flame does result in the generation of sound at the frequency of the imposed electric field. In fact it was even possible to transmit music with considerable fidelity; hence, the term singing flame.
