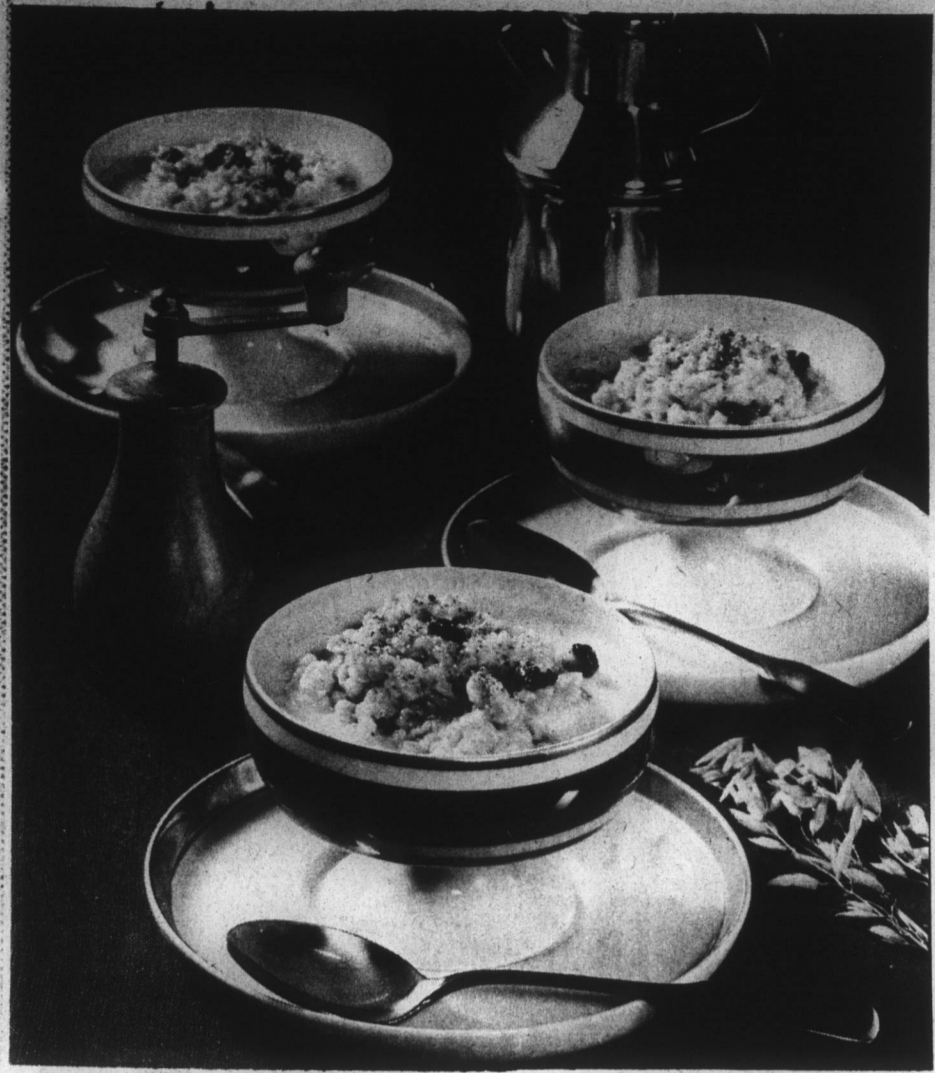

September is better breakfast month.

Now's the time to stock up on new and different ideas for starting off the day.

Tempting the no-breakfast set is a difficult chore for most homemakers. The kids find it very hard to pass up dessert, so why not dessert for breakfast?

Easy Raisin Pudding, thoroughly modern in its case of preparation, is just plain old-fashioned in good taste. Don't tell the teens, but it's good for you, too!

Instant oatmeal is a real handy and delicious cool-weather cereal to have on the shelf and a favorite at our house is that flavored with raisins and spice.

This dessert, which also is a great and nutritious day-starter should be served warm topped with milk or cream.

Easy Raisin Pudding  
1 egg yolk, beaten.

2 cups milk.  
3 packets instant oatmeal with raisins and, spice, uncooked.  
3 tablespoons sugar.  
1 teaspoon vanilla.  
Fresh nutmeg.

Combine egg yolk and two tablespoons of the milk; set aside. Bring remaining milk to a boil. Stir in oatmeal, sugar and vanilla. Gradually add egg yolk-milk mixture, stirring constantly. Cook over low heat five minutes, stirring occasionally. Spoon into serving bowls. Grate fresh nutmeg over each serving. Serve with milk or cream.

The combination of apple oatmeal, cinnamon and pecan is perfect for a coffee cake. Many breakfast foods are included right in the cake, with three of them in one convenient ingredient — instant oatmeal with apples and cinnamon.

Next time you're having company for breakfast or brunch or when you want to surprise the family for Sunday breakfast, serve a breakfast ring. To dress this coffee cake up, drizzle the top with a maple-flavored confectioners' sugar glaze and garnish with pecan halves.

**Apple Oatmeal Breakfast Cake**

1/2 cup shortening, soft.  
1/2 cup sugar.  
2 eggs.  
1 1/4 cups sifted flour.  
2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder.  
1/2 teaspoon salt.  
1/2 cup milk.  
2 packets instant oatmeal with apples and cinnamon uncooked.  
1/3 cup chopped pecans.  
Heat oven to 350 degrees. Beat shortening and sugar together until creamy. Add eggs, beating until light and fluffy. Sift together flour, nutmeg and baking powder. Add oatmeal, apples, pecans and milk. Beat until well mixed. Pour into a greased 9x9 inch pan. Bake 35 minutes.
