can't be beat. Make up a few loaves and for a quick dessert serve them topped with fresh cranberry sauce and whipped cream.

Cranberry Spice Nut Bread
½ cup sugar.
¾ cup milk.
1 egg, beaten.
¼ teaspoon salt.
¼ teaspoon ginger.
¼ teaspoon cinnamon.
1 teaspoon lemon extract.
3 cups biscuit mix.
1 cup fresh cranberries, coarsely chopped.
½ cup chopped walnuts.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine sugar, milk and egg. Add salt, ginger, cinnamon, lemon extract and biscuit mix; beat vigorously for 30 seconds. Fold in cranberries and nuts. Spoon into a well-greased loaf pan. Bake for 60 to 65 minutes, or until loaf is browned. Remove from pan and cool thoroughly before slicing. For individual loaves bake 35 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve these little ones with delicious Cranberry Butter Jam.

Cranberry Butter Jam
2 cups fresh cranberries.
1 cup sugar.
½ cup water.
¼ cup chopped walnuts.
Juice of 1 lemon.
2 tablespoons butter or margarine.
Combine cranberries, sugar and water in saucepan. Bring to a boil and cook, stirring occasionally, until cranberries pop. Stir in walnuts, lemon juice and butter. Serve warm.

Here's the frosting shortcut of the year! Make a wonderful creamy chocolate frosting with an easy recipe. Then freeze it for the time you'll need to frost a quickie cake or cupcakes. This will keep soft and creamy on a cake for at least three days and, if frozen, it will keep indefinitely.

Creamy Semi-Sweet Frosting
1 pkg. (6 oz.) Nestle's Semi-Sweet Chocolate Morsels.
¼ cup shortening.
¼ teaspoon salt.
½ cup evaporated milk.
1 jar (7½ oz.) marshmallow cream.

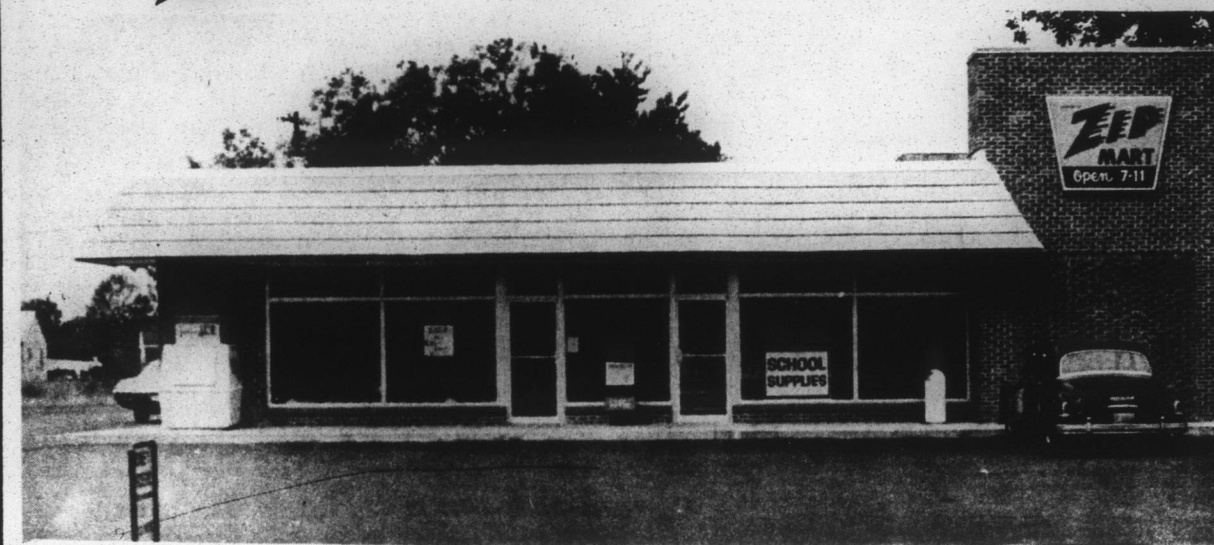
Melt semi-sweet chocolate morsels and shortening over hot (not boiling) water. Add salt; remove from heat. Gradually add evaporated milk; stir until smooth. Let cool, approximately 10 minutes. Add marshmallow cream and beat until smooth. Makes enough frosting and filling for a two-layer cake or two dozen cupcakes. To freeze turn frosting into container. Wrap properly for freezing. When ready to use, let frosting stand at room temperature until soft enough to spread, about one hour.

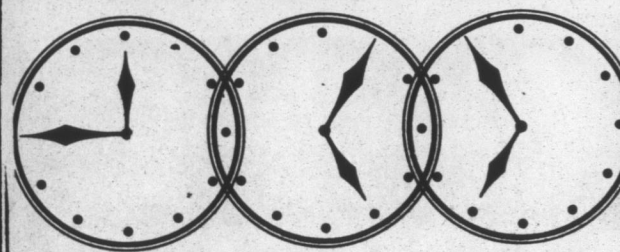
