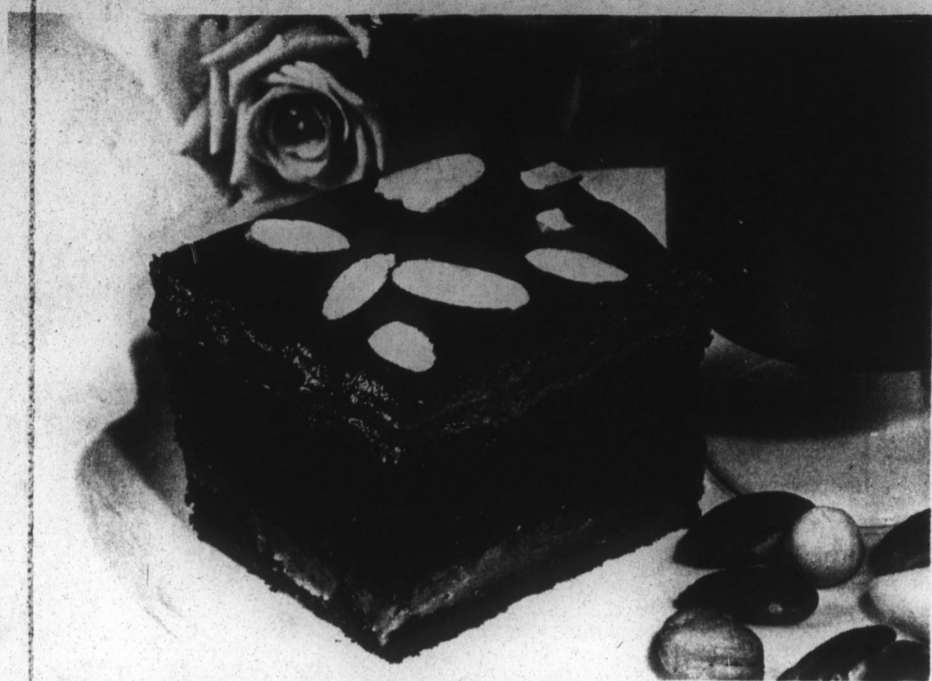

## From The Chowan Herald Kitchen

Rice is nice! It's plentiful, too. What's more, it's economical.

Many of us would not know how to plan a week of menus without including rice a few times and in different form. We offer you a few recipes which are easily prepared and are delicious.

1 can chicken-rice soup. Brown chops, salt and pepper. Place rice in baking dish. Pour orange juice over rice. Arrange browned pork chops on rice. Pour soup over all. Cover. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour.

**Little-Time Chicken**  
1 stick margarine, melted.  
1 cup uncooked rice.  
1 can onion soup.  
1 broiler-fryer, cut into serving pieces.  
Salt and pepper.  
Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Place margarine in bottom of a baking dish. Pour rice on melted margarine; add soup. Place chicken on top of rice. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Bake for one hour. Serves five. Note: Cream of mushroom, tomato or cream of celery soup may be used instead of onion.

**Festive Orange Rice**  
2 tablespoons minced onion.  
2/3 cup chopped celery.  
3 tablespoons margarine.  
1 cup uncooked rice.  
2 tablespoons grated orange rind.  
1 cup orange juice.  
1 1/2 cups water.  
1 1/4 teaspoons salt.  
Pinch of thyme.  
Cook onions and celery in margarine in saucepan until tender. Add remaining ingredients; bring to a boil. Lower heat, cover and simmer about 20 minutes or until rice is tender. Remove from heat; toss lightly with a fork. Replace lid and let stand until rice is dry, five or 10 minutes.

**Quickie Dinner**  
6 pork chops.  
1 1/3 cup Minute Rice.  
1 cup orange juice.

**Company Chicken**  
2 lbs. chicken pieces.  
2 tablespoons shortening.  
1 can brown gravy with onions.  
1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms.  
1/4 cup green pepper strips.

In skillet, brown chicken in shortening; pour off fat. Stir in gravy and mushrooms. Cover; cook over low heat 30 minutes. Add green pepper; cook 15 minutes more. Stir now and then. Makes four servings.  
Now for the dessert which uses mixes to make it easier to assemble than you would think at first glance. It was developed in the Pillsbury Company kitchens and is bound to be yummy.

**Caramel-In-Between Fudge Cake**  
1 pkg. fudge cake mix.  
1 cup water.  
1 tablespoon solid shortening, if desired.  
3 eggs.  
1/3 cup sliced almonds, toasted.

**Filling**  
28 light caramels.  
1 can (15 oz.) sweetened condensed milk.  
1 tablespoon butter or margarine.

**Frosting**  
1/4 cup butter or margarine, softened.  
2 envelopes premelted chocolate.  
3 tablespoons cream or milk.

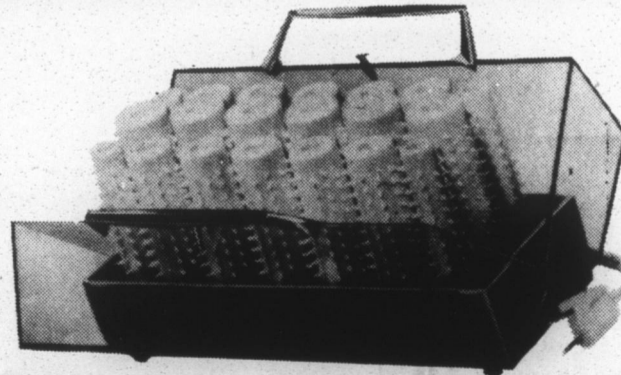
