Official Ballot For District Judges, Solicitor, State Senate, State House and County Officials

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER

- To vote for all candidates of one party (a straight ticket) make a cross (X) mark in the circle of the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.
- To vote for candidate of more than one party (a split ticket) do not mark in any party circle, but make a cross (X) mark in the square opposite the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.
- If you should insert a cross (X) mark in one of the party circles at the top of the ballot and also mark in the voting square opposite the name of any candidate of any party, your ballot will be counted as a straight ticket vote for all of the candidates of the party whose circle you marked.
- If you tear or deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it and get another.

OFFICIAL BALLOT FOR STATE OFFICERS OF THE GENERAL COURT OF JUSTICE

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER

- To vote for all candidates of one party (a straight ticket), make a cross (X) mark in the circle of the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.
- To vote for candidates of more than one party (a split ticket), do not mark in any party circle, but make a cross (X) mark in the square opposite the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.
