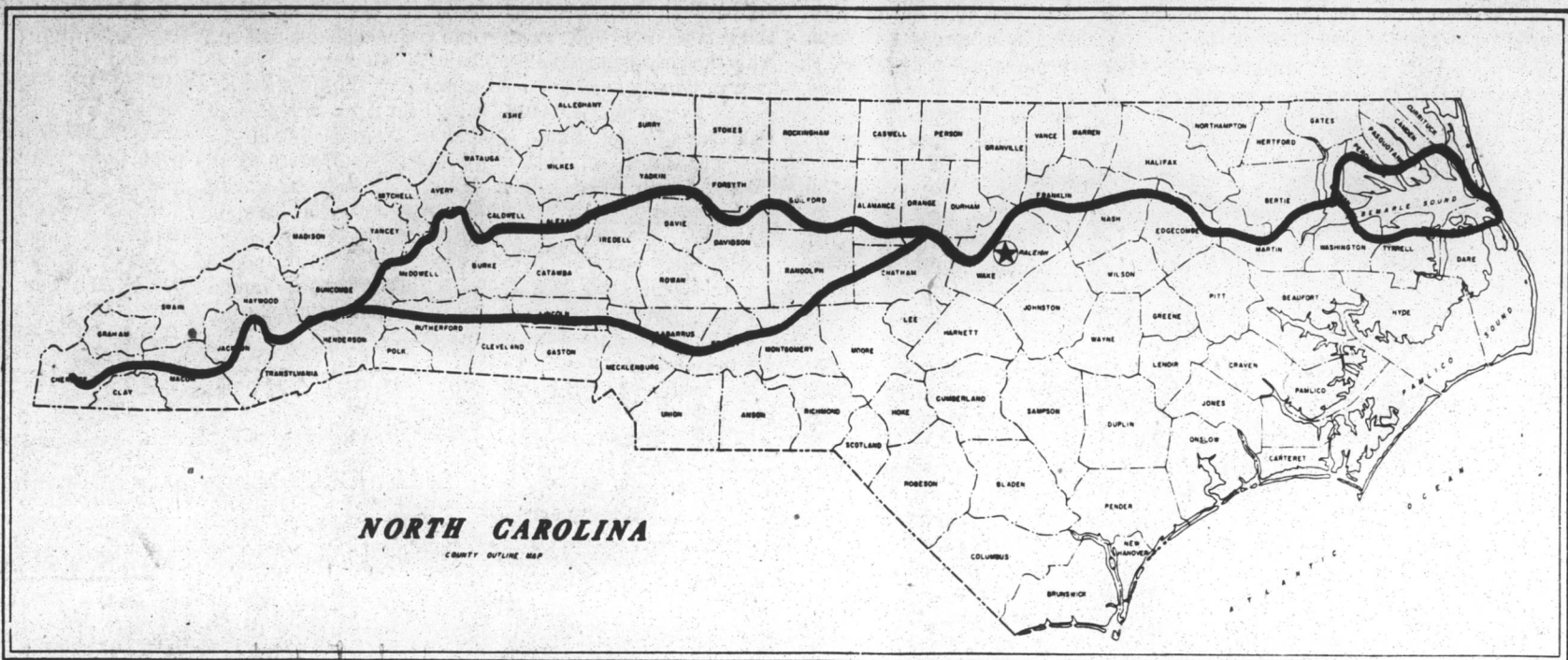


NORTH CAROLINA BICENTENNIAL BICYCLE ROUTE



Cross-State Bicycle Route A Reality

RALEIGH—N. C. Department of Transportation (DOT) officials have selected North Carolina's first cross-state bicycle route.

The 600-mile course, known as the Bicentennial Bicycle Route, runs from deep within the Appalachian Mountains to the coastal Outer Banks. This route is the first of five or six such bicycle routes to be designated throughout the state.

The Bicentennial Bicycle Route was developed, over a two-year period, by DOT's Bicycle Program staff. "Our primary purpose in selecting the route was to provide some measure of safety for the bicycling public. In selecting the bike route, our staff chose

roadways with low traffic volumes and good road conditions," explained Curtis B. Yates, N. C. Bicycle Program Coordinator.

Yates said that his staff is in the process of producing a bicycle route pamphlet that will include detailed maps of the Bicentennial Bicycle Route along with a descriptive narrative and information about service facilities and other points of interest. He added, "The bike route pamphlet will be available to the public and we hope to have it ready in the next two or three months."
