

More Accidents Involving Bicycles Are Anticipated


RALEIGH-Although the number of bicycle accidents has been somewhat constant during the past two years, there is concern that there will be an increase this year. With the emphasis on energy conservation and physical fitness the number of bicyclists using the highways is rapidly increasing. The age of cyclists is also on the rise. In 1975, for example, of the 32 bicyclists killed, 10 were in the age group of 20 to 44. The increase in the


