Price Differential Meeting

Secretary of Agriculture is considering continuing to Bob Bergland on April 11 make price support announced that a meeting. will be held on May 5 to hear recommendations on the 1976-crop peanut price support differentials. Price differentials are factors that allow the U.S. Department of Agriculture to take into account differences in value between types and grades of peanuts when making loans to producers.

Sec. Bergland said that he is calling on representatives of the nation's peanut farmers and the peanut industry to convene prior to the meeting to work out a unified recommendation to be presented at the May 5 session. The collective recommendation should be fair to all producers, shellers, manufacturers, and consumers alike, he advised.

The meeting will begin at 9 A.M. in the Jefferson Auditorium, USDA's South Building, and will be open to dustry recommendation has been presented, the meeting will be opened to discussion from the floor.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture on April 18 announced that the price support levels for eligible kinds of tobacco will be about 7.3 per cent above those in effect last year. The 1977 support prices, by kind, and comparable 1976 rates are as follows:

This ratio (2.05) is then multiplied by the 1959 support level for each kind of tobacco to determine the 1977 support level. In 1976, support prices were 191 per cent of the 1959 prices; for 1977, support prices are 205 per cent of 1959.
