"Send A Mouse To College" will be the cry of the Edenton Methodist Youth Fellowship volunteers Saturday, who will be conducting the Mouse Project to aid research. Mouse buttons will be on sale at the shopping centers and in the downtown business areas.

Citizens will be asked to purchase a button indicating they have contributed 50 cents toward purchasing a mouse to be used for research at Duke University and UNC-Chapel Hill. This is the estimated cost of raising a mouse, putting it to sleep, performing an autopsy and staining tissues

for study of cancer.

This is the fourth year the MYF group have conducted the mouse project. "Let's send many mice to represent Chowan County for cancer research," a spokesman stated.

All proceeds from the buttons will be credited to the Chowan County unit of the American Cancer Society.
