FACTS & FIGURES

There are about 45,000 young men and women in America who are members of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve. They earn about \$1,300 while on active duty and a minimum of \$643.23 a year for working one weekend a month and two weeks a year with the corps.



Young people who join the Marine Corps Reserve up to six months before they graduate from high school can earn money at monthly meetings and still stay in school, becoming Marine Reservists within 60 days after graduation.

Most Americans can get details about the range of programs and opportunities in the Marine Corps Reserve by calling, toll-free, (800) 423-2600. Californians get the information by calling, also toll-free, (800) 252-0241.

Marine Reservists can take advantage of tuition-free correspondence courses through the Marine Corps Institute, or take some of the more than 6,200 courses available, free, through the United States Armed Forces Institute.
