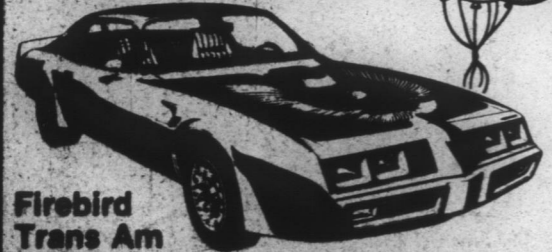
Third Place Won By Miss Jordan
