Business Activity Declines

The level of business activity in North Carolina declined slightly in April, according to the Wachovia Business Index. The Index registered 155.5, 0.3 per cent below the March level.

The decrease in the Index resulted from lower non-agricultural employment and average manufacturing workweek. Average hourly earnings were up modestly.

The decline in manufacturing employment reflected decreases in the non-durable goods sector, where employment in textiles and apparel was down.

Non-manufacturing employment was down marginally. Increases in

construction and government employment were balanced by declines in services and trade.

The seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate for North Carolina was 4.8 per cent in April, up 0.3 per cent from March. The national rate for April was 5.8 per cent, up 0.1 per cent. The unadjusted unemployment rate in North Carolina was 4.6 per cent in April.

Unit sales of cars were up in April for the first time; this year surpassed the same period of 1978. Truck sales for the month were down and year-to-date sales continued below the levels of 1978.
