## Mayor And Councilmen Continue Squabble Over Charter Changes

Administrator Gardner reported that he was continuing to receive complaints regarding cars parking on the sidewalk near the intersection of Albemarle and Oakum. He suggested that the Council consider placing a barrier of some type (either poles or cement). He was directed to place cement barriers on a trial basis.




