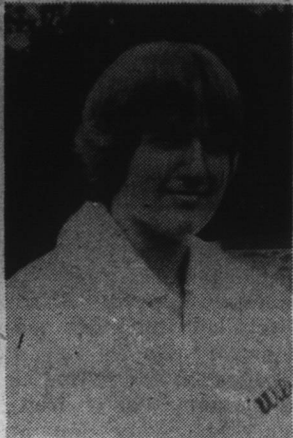

### Soil Scientist Arrives

There is a new soil scientist working with the statewide soil survey project in the Albemarle Conservation District. He is John M. Scott.

John will work on the N. C. Soil Survey project and has been assigned to work in the Albemarle Conservation District.

John is a native of Windlake, Wisc. and attended the University of Wisconsin. He received his degree in Soil Science and Resource Management in December, 1978.

John began work May 29 and will train for a couple of weeks in Hertford, where he now lives. After the initial training program, he will

help with the survey in Currituck County, which should be completed about December; then return to Perquimans and Chowan counties to help finalize the soil survey here.

The position which John is filling is possible because of a unique arrangement between the SCS, the N. C. Department of Natural Resources and Community Development, and local county governments. This program allows the state to hire and pay for soil scientists who will work directly with SCS in counties which are contributing funds for an on-going soil survey.

### Meeting Postponed

Jehovah's Witnesses in Edenton are cancelling their meeting here from June 14 to 17 to attend a four-day district convention in Hampton, Va., Fletcher Gardner, presiding minister of the Edenton congregation, said today.

Approximately, 100 persons will represent the Edenton congregation. Over 6,000 persons are expected to attend the meeting which begins in the Hampton Coliseum Thursday morning and ends Sunday evening. Sessions begin at 9:30 A.M. and run til 5:30 P.M.

Two duplicate conventions have been scheduled for the city of Hampton to assure adequate seating. The first convention, held June 14 - 17 drew delegates from Eastern Virginia, Maryland and part of Delaware. The convention which begins Thursday will draw delegates from Western

Virginia and the Carolinas. Ninety-three conventions are scheduled to be held in major cities across the United States during June and July, Gardner said.


The family-type program will have something for everyone, Gardner said.

Since 1979 marks the 100th anniversary of publication of "The Watchtower" magazine, several talks are devoted to the expansion of Jehovah's Witnesses during the past 100 years, Gardner said. The organization has grown from a handful in 1879 to over 2-million today. The Witnesses are active in 205 lands including 40 countries where their work is banned. The Watchtower magazine has increased its circulation from 6,000 copies in 1879 to 9,200,000 copies and is published in 82 languages.

Three Bible dramas in full costume are included in the program.
