

Peanut Trading Termed Slow

Southeastern Section — Trading for peanuts grown in the Southeast was moderate early in the week but slow towards the end of the week as shellers held back offerings due to prolonged rainfall. Demand was fairly light and prices were unchanged. Frequent and steady rainfall brought harvesting to a halt in much of the Southeast during the week. Peanuts dug in the field for drying were not gathered due to excessive moisture. Shellers adopted a "wait and see" attitude and most offerings were for nearby shipment. Prices paid per pound for Southeastern area Runner type peanuts, new crop, sold on an FOB shipping point basis were for Jumbo for prompt shipment 35 1/4 cents, for October to December shipment 36; medium September to October 34 1/4, for export October to November 33 1/4; Number One October to December few 33 1/4; 14-16s prompt 26 1/2, September to January 27.

Virginia-North Carolina Section — Trading for peanuts grown in the Virginia-North Carolina area was fairly slow. Demand was fairly light and prices were about unchanged. Wet weather early in the week prevented harvesting but digging should become active during the week beginning October 1. Some peanuts were immature but overall crop prospects remained fairly good. Prices paid per pound for Virginia type peanuts, new crop, sold on an FOB shipping point basis for October to December shipment unless otherwise stated were for unshelled Jumbo 41 cents; Fancy mostly 34 to 34 1/2, October to March 35; shelled medium October to March few 37; Number One 32 to 32 1/2, October to March 32 1/2 to 33, October to May 33, December to April 33 1/4; Number Two with 70 per cent splits 32, January to June 33.

Southwestern Section —

Trading for peanuts grown in the Southwest was fairly active. Demand was fairly good and prices were unchanged. Harvest progressed well in Texas and Oklahoma. Harvest in New Mexico expected to start next week. Crop prospects there remain good and weather has been favorable. Prices paid per pound for Southwestern grown shelled peanuts, new crop, sold on an FOB shipping point basis for prompt shipment unless otherwise stated were for Spanish Jumbo 39 1/2 cents, October to March also 39 1/2; Number One 38 1/2, October to March few 38 1/2, October to May few 38 1/4; U. S. Splits October to March 35; Runners Jumbo 36; medium few 34 to 35, October to December 34; Number One 32 1/2; U. S. Splits 34 1/2, October to April 34 1/2.


