The guitar was introduced into Spain by the Moors.

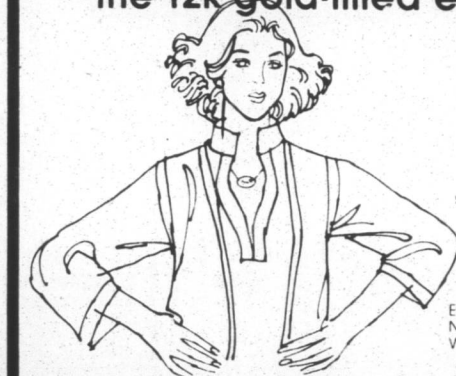
