

Hunt Proclaims N.C. "Clean Up Litter Week"

SOUTHERN PINES — More than 5,000 miles of state highways were cleaned as a result of the statewide "Clean Up Litter" campaign according to a report presented by state Secretary of Transportation Tom Bradshaw to the Board

of Transportation during its monthly meeting here Friday. In a special effort to keep North Carolina beautiful, Gov. Jim Hunt proclaimed the week of October 15-20 as "Clean Up Litter Week." Division of Highways

personnel estimate that 9,000 cubic yards (approximately 2,250 dump truck loads) of litter were collected by 330 transportation crews statewide in conjunction with more than 100 local government and volunteer

organizations. Sec. Bradshaw expressed his appreciation to the many city and county leaders for their support. "The response has been overwhelming. The partnership of local governments and citizen groups with state

government is an important reminder that by working together, we can accomplish just about anything we focus our combined energies upon. We were also very pleased to have the endorsement and cooperation of 'Keep North Carolina Beautiful, Inc.'" he said. According to M. C. Adams, manager of maintenance, the state expended \$237,918 for manpower, equipment, materials and communication support.

Social Security: Medicare News

Field Representative SUPPLEMENTING MEDICARE COVERAGE:

Medicare covers most major health care costs but it doesn't pay all your medical expenses.

Don't cancel any private insurance you have now if you aren't yet eligible for Medicare — especially if you have dependents who are covered under your present policy.

For that reason, many private insurance companies sell health insurance policies to supplement Medicare.

But others may provide the same coverage you have under Medicare and won't pay any benefits if Medicare does. Make sure you don't buy a policy which is unnecessary or which duplicates your Medicare protection.

You also should know that no private company or agent selling insurance to supplement Medicare is connected with the Federal Government. Some companies use names, designs, or envelopes that can give the impression they are connected with the Government in some way.

If you are thinking of buying private insurance to supplement your Medicare protection, we suggest that you closely examine the benefits offered by the policy.

If you are just becoming eligible for Medicare and you already have private health insurance, you may want to get in touch with your insurance agent to discuss your insurance needs in relation to Medicare.

To help people who have medicare decide whether they need private supplemental insurance, Social Security has a pamphlet called "Guide to health insurance for people with Medicare."

Some policies will pay for services which are not covered by Medicare.

Some pay the deductibles and other dollar amounts that Medicare does not pay.

This pamphlet explains what Medicare covers, describes the kinds of private insurance supplements available, and provides useful information to beneficiaries considering the purchase of supplemental insurance.

Free copies of the guide are available at social security offices, State Insurance Departments, and many senior citizens' centers.
