

TEACHING TEACHERS — Handwriting was one of the various types of In-Service Workshops provided for Edenton-Chowan's K-6 teachers recently. Mike Gregory, left, a representative of the Zaner-Bloser Professional Handwriting Consultant Service, impressed upon teachers that writing is a learned skill, the proper teaching of which takes time and drill, just as in other subject areas. As he involved Mrs. Ruby Bond, Third Grade teacher at D. F. Walker School, right, in one of his demonstrations of handwriting techniques, Gregory pointed out to the fifty-one teachers that writing is a multisensory learning process which begins with a child's readiness by kindergarten age. Motor skills and knowledge of directional terms and shapes play an important part in a child's ability to learn writing. Following the mastery of manuscript (printing) which a child first learns, there is a crucial transitional teaching process, usually near the end of the Second Grade, which leads to the correct learning of cursive (real, in a child's vernacular) writing.

Parrish, who said the county Farm Bureau has a goal of adding 200 new members this year, pointed out that by working through their marketing asociation, members have the opportunity to improve their marketing opportunities in a number of commodity areas. He said that in all major commodity areas there are active committees which make studies, draw up recommendations, and work to help solve the special problems of the particular producers.

According to Parrish, when a farmer joins Farm Bureau he also becomes eligible for a number of services, including estate planning consultation and participation in a property identification plan and theft reward program to help safeguard their property.

"I urge all farmers to give serious consideration to joining Farm Bureau during 1979 membership campaign," Parrish said. "By doing so, they will become part of a strong and influential team working on issues directly affecting them.


