GREENVILLE—Aphasia treatment, evaluation of motor speech disorders, autism and management of the exceptional child are among the topics to be discussed at East Carolina University's tenth annual Speech and Hearing Symposium Feb. 28-29.

The symposium, sponsored by the ECU chapter of the National Student Speech and Hearing Association, is open to the public. All events will be held in the Carol Belk Auditorium.

Guest speakers will include: Dr. Leonard LaPointe, coordinator of instruction in audiology and speech pathology at the Veteran's Administration Medical Center, Grainsville, Fla.; Dr. Mariana Newton, director of the UNC-Greensboro Speech and Hearing Center;

Dr. Hal Shigley, clinical director of the Eastern TEACCH Center, Greenville; Dr. Betty Levey, professor of special education at ECU and Dr. Stephen Tacker, professor of psychology at ECU.

head gas prices as provided by the Natural Gas Policy Act of 1978, will result in virtually a constant share of the average family budget being spent on natural gas heating while oil and electric heating expenditures will continue to be more expensive than gas.

A.G.A. projects the cost of natural gas in 1980 to be \$3.45 per million Btu., no. 2 fuel oil at \$5.22 and electricity at \$14.82 to the residential consumer.

Natural gas is now the largest source of domestically produced energy in the U.S., supplying more than half of all residences and commercial establishments in the country and 40 per cent of the fuel required by the industrial and agricultural sectors, according to the A.G.A.

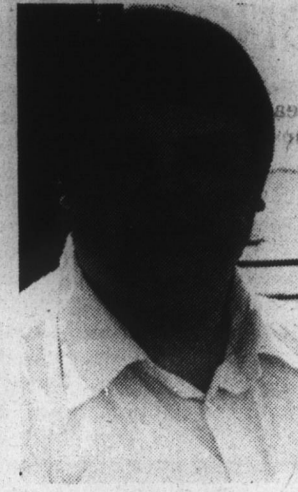

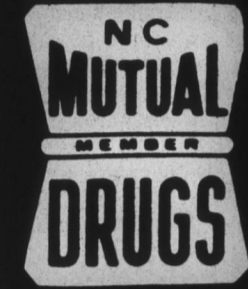

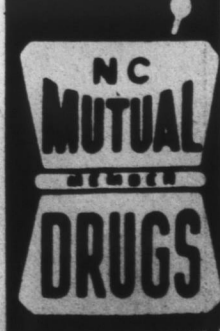
