### **Operation Overcharge**

WASHINGTON Operation Overcharge's effort to gain parity in electric rates for the people of Northeastern North Carolina has now entered its third phase, its leader declared Tuesday.

"With the announcement Friday of an investigation of Vepco by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, we have ended the second phase of our efforts and have moved into the third," J. Larkin Little of Greenville, Overcharge Chairman, explained.

Little said he was quite surprised that FERC's announcement came while his group was in Washington, D.C., meeting on strategy with other organizations and agencies that have joined in the Overcharge battle. "That makes it sound like political manuevering," Little said. 'Well, it's the first time that FERC has ever ordered an investigation of a power company, and we recognize it as a major milestone," Little said. "But," he said, "there are some things we don't like about the particullar investigation or-

dered," he pointed out. Under FERC's plan, Little pointed out, a non-public investigation would be conducted by the enforcement arm of the commission, presented to the commission, and then FERC would decide whether to go public. It would take about eight months to complete the

preliminary investigation. 'We think nothing needs the light of public sunshine more than the management and operations of Vepco, and we'd like to see the investigation public from the start," Little said. "We don't believe FERC's enforcement staff is equipped to conduct the kind of investigation that's needed and, from that standpoint,
