## Board To Hold Hearings

RALIEGH — The North Carolina Board of Agriculture will hold public hearings on Friday, April 25 to consider amendments to regulations promulgated by the state Department of Agriculture.

The first hearing, beginning at 10 A.M. in the board room of the Agriculture Building in Raleigh, will consider extension of the provision to permit half-pricing of motor fuel on pumps not equipped to register the over \$1.00 price. Set to expire on July 1st, oil jobbers in the state indicate equipment has not been available to permit the conversion and the deadline cannot be met.

In other hearings the board will discuss cattle brucellosis regulations at 2 P.M., Contagious Equine Metritis in horses at 2:30 and the reporting of cotton acreage at 3 o'clock.

Anyone having an interest in these matters is urged to be present to make their views known to the Board.

## Deadline May 1 Scholarship Applications Available

Area high school graduates who plan to enroll in a college transfer program at College of The Albemarle this fall may apply for the Alexandra K. Boda Citizenship Award, according to Barbara Riccardo, foreign language instructor. The application

deadline is May 1. The competitive scholarship is available to graduates from high schools in the seven counties served by the college. Present scholarship holders who are returning to COA may reapply. Mrs. Riccardo

said. The award provides funds for in-state tuition, fees, and limited book expenses for one academic year. High school students must rank in the upper half of their graduating class.

Other criteria for eligibility requires applicants to submit a short history of present and past community, school, and or church activities; two letters of reference; and a brief essay.

The essay requirement lists two optional topics, "Improving Citizenship Through a Community College Education," or "How College of The Albemarle Will Help Me Achieve My Goals in Life." Interested students may obtain detailed information by contacting Mrs. Riccardo at the college. The selection of a recipient for the award will be made and announced during the month of June.




