week's opening session of the 1980 General Assembly that the lawmakers might very well bypass the 1979 Closing Adjourment Resolution. That resolution severely restricted discussion and voting topics for this session to budgetary matters and a few other well-defined issues.

While most observers assumed the Assembly would not adhere strictly within the "budgetary guidelines," no one was quite prepared for the grab bag of items included in the Joint Resolution relating to which bills might be considered during this session.

The 16-item agenda that passed out of the Senate last week accumulated two more possibilities as it was amended in the House.

The lengthy resolution as amended, (two and a half pages) contained several "housekeeping" bills pushed by the governor that would alleviate problems caused or uncovered by previous legislation.

Included in this category were bills that would allow postponement of the effective dates for certain portions of the Speedy Trials
