

Views on Dental Health



ER SORES

The canker sore (or apthous ulcer) is one of the best known and most persistently annoying dental lesions. It is small and whitish and may occur on the gums, cheeks or tongue. It appears singly and in clusters. A blister usually forms first, without notice, then breaks to form an open sore or canker. Then the acute pain begins.

The open canker sore is especially sensitive to touch and to hot or spicy foods. Fortunately, the lifetime of the canker

sore normally runs its course in about a week or ten days.

No good treatment is known for its cure at present. There's not much you can do except to make sure you avoid irritating foods. Some people are especially prone to canker sores. They seem to run in families and there may be a connection between canker attacks and emotional stress, though there is still no definite information on the cause of this puzzling disorder.

A dentist can treat canker sores to relieve the pain. However, certain kinds of cankers tend to persist or come back in spite of any treatment now known.




