

POLICY-USE OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS

1. Governmental building shall only be made available when not being utilized by governmental agencies.

2. When governmental facilities are used for profitmaking activities, or by a profit-making corporation, foundation or association, rental fees shall be charged.

3. Governmental facilities shall not be used for regularly scheduled religious services. Newly formed or independent religious groups shall not use governmental facilities for organizational purposes or worship services. Organized religious groups may request the regular use of governmental buildings in event that the church facilities are burned or in similar emergency conditions...

4. No alcoholic beverages may be used in governmental facilities at any time.

5. The Board of County Commissioners and the Town Council assume no liability for personal injuries or other damages resulting from the use of governmental buildings by an
