The ECSU "Vikings" won their conference opener against the Bulldogs of Bowie State. The Vikings record is now 1 win no loss and 1 tie. Their next game will be against Virginia State, the 20th of September at Elizabeth City.

Defensive tackle James Hamilton set-up the first Viking score, mid-way thru the first quarter, with his fumble recovery on the 28 yard line of the Bulldogs. Running back Gary Sneed-Spyve scored from the one yard line on the sixth play the drive. John Norris kicked the extra point.

Early in the fourth quarter the Bulldogs scored on their sixth play of a 36 yard drive. Their running attempt of the extra point failed.

The Vikings scored again in the middle of the fourth quarter to top a 63 yard scoring drive. Running back James Best broke thru from the 23 yard line for the score. The kick by John Norris was good.

The Vikings put the game out of reach when Defensive back Dwight Taylor intercepted a Bowie pass with 51 seconds left in the game.
