

Both are wellqualified for their work, and have done extremely well thus far. William Reeves, counselor for the carpentry students, and Louis Nixon, counselor for the welding students, work individually with the students and give their advice and help when

need for people with these skills, and the CDC program There are two six-month sessions per year. According to CDC Executive

Director, Robert E. White, the current session will run through September 30. After the students finish their six-month training

period, Barbara Smith, jobdeveloper at CDC, then works with each individual on job-seeking procedures and helping to place them in unsubsidized employment. Mrs. Smith helped two graduates of the last program, William Neely and L. A. Chesson, obtain a job at Freeman Metal Products, Inc. in Ahoskie.
