Infants First Home Cleaning

Home dental care should really begin before baby has a single tooth. Plaque can form on the gum pads just as it forms on the teeth. While mother cleans her baby from top to bottom every day, she sometimes forgets that juice, formula, cereal, milk and so on, leave debris in the mouth. A piece of gauze can be used to wipe the gums after the last feeding of the day, and this may help to reduce gum inflammation which is especially inportant as the child begins

Many dentists feel that plaque-caused inflammation of the gum is a factor in teething dif-ficulties, and if plaque is removed regularly, the

teething process will be more comfortable. The cleaning, of course, is to be continued after the first teeth appear.

One technique that has been used successfully is for the parents to sit on chairs facing each other, and while one parent supports the legs, the other holds the child's head softly in his or her lap and gently wipes the teeth with gauze from behind the head.
