Dear Citizens:
President Franklin Roosevelt proclaimed the day the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor as a "day that will live in infamy." Webster defines "infamy" to mean ill repute; extreme vileness. Pearl Harbor began World War II for the United States, the dropping of nuclear bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki ended it. The dropping of the bombs on August 6 and August 14, 1945 are indeed days exemplified by Webster's definition of "infamy." Those who survived will never forget the blinding light and the mushroom cloud, and the path of killed, obliterated and wounded left. It happened once, it happened to them, and it can happen again... to us... to the entire world.

All the good causes that we can work for are overshadowed by the annihilation of mankind by nuclear war. Life as we know it is in jeopardy. Are we doing anything about it?
