The funds, which are management. awarded under the Federal Strengthening Developing Institutions Program, will be used by the college from October, 1981, through September 1982. Harriette Crump, director

of resource development, said COA will extend its growth in three areas during the grant period. "The needs emerged from a planning study which the college has conducted this year," she said. The study, which is still in progress, was made possible by a \$158,000 Title III grant last year.

Priorities established by the self-assessment include the improvement of administration and management through a management information system, the implementation of a developmental education program, and strengthening the college's staff development program.

Plans are underway to implement a computerbased MIS at the college. Grant funds will be used to purchase the necessary equipment, according to Crump. She said the new S system will greatly improve the availability and han-


