Guide Issued For Marsh Plants

When you see sea oats and beach grass you know you're near the ocean. But what about the plants around the marsh? UNC Sea Grant's latest publication, A Guide to Salt Marsh Plants Common to North Carolina, may help. Designed as a working key and picture guide for educational field trips, the 32-page booklet can help anyone identify the common shrubs, vines, herbs and grasses thriving in the marsh. The guide, written by Elizabeth Jean Wilson of the Hampton Mariners Museum, also supplies background information about the salt marsh—its value, its characteristics and its zonation. A drawing accompanies each plant listed in the booklet, along with a written description of the plant's leaf arrangement, flowers and fruits. Wilson also includes some of the common uses of these plants through history—in teas, salads and medicine.
