There were numerous showers and luncheons for the bride.

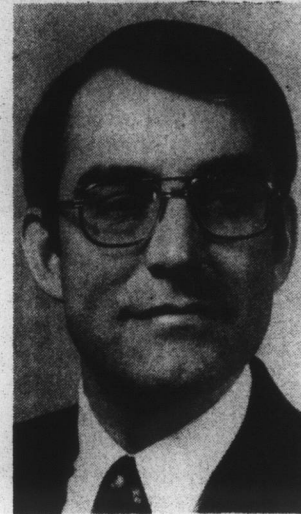

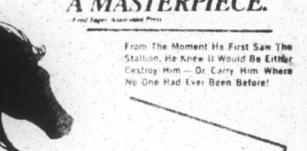
