Around The Farms

The annual Peanut Field Day will be held at the Peanut Belt Research Station in Lewiston on September 10, 1981. We think that the annual Field Day is one of the best opportunities to learn about peanuts that we have.

Marketing situation will be addressed by B. E. Marks, Jr. Frank McGill, Extension Agronomist - Peanuts, Georgia, will address the group on prospects for peanut control program in 1982. McGill is stationed at Tifton, Georgia, near President Carter's home.

Substitute Teacher Workshop Slated
A series of workshops for veteran and prospective substitute teachers has been scheduled for September 10 and 11 at the Edenton Municipal Building. The format in scheduling of the workshops is somewhat different from that of past years.

For persons already on the approved substitute teacher list and for persons holding teaching certificates, registration will begin at 9 A. M. September 10. This session, conducted by Jake Boyce, will end at 10:15 A. M. This will be the only workshop required for this group.

Persons not on the approved list or not holding a teacher's certificate are requested to register at 10:30 A. M. September 10. The workshop for new substitutes will last until 2:45 P. M., with an hour's lunch break from 12:15 P. M. - 1:15 P. M. New substitutes will have the opportunity to meet school principals and observe in classrooms, in addition to receiving pertinent information needed by substitutes.

On September 11, only new substitutes are required to attend the workshop from 9 A. M. to 3 P. M. with a lunch break from 12:15 to 1:15 P. M. Mary Nixon, Joyce Cole and Shelby Strother will be conducting consecutive sessions on characteristics of the primary, middle school and high school student.

Cotton Defoliation
Defoliation of cotton is a job coming up for cotton farmers. Why defoliate? Defoliation is the application of chemicals to encourage or force the cotton leaves to drop. Defoliation is normally a profitable practice and should be a part of a complete production program. Benefits from defoliation include:

- Elimination of the main source of stain and trash
- Better grades
- Retarding of boll rot
- Faster and more efficient picker operation
- Faster and more efficient picker operation
- Faster opening and drying out of bolls, allowing harvest to begin earlier in the season
- Quicker drying of dew, allowing picking to begin earlier in the day
- Straightening of lodged plants for more efficient picking

Timing and Conditions
Weather conditions at the time of application and for 3 to 5 days following application have a large effect on the response to defoliant. Defoliants are most active when the temperature, sunlight intensity, and relative humidity are high. A nighttime temperature above 60 degrees fahrenheit is especially important.

Apply defoliants when at least 60 per cent of the bolls

Simmons To Represent COA

Simmons will attend the five regular meetings and any special sessions of the committee which are scheduled during the year. Meetings are held at the Office of General Administration in Chapel Hill on the second Wednesday of the months of September, November, January, March

and May. The dean has been associated with COA since 1966, when he first was employed as a counselor. In 1972, he assumed the duties as dean of student services, which later became the present student development division. He has served in that capacity for the last nine years.
