Golf Championship

Four area golfers will compete in the N. C. Walter Hagen State Golf Championship on September 6 and 7. Bob Kelly, the golf pro at Chowan Golf and Country Club, along with Coach Tom Bass, Tommy Bass, and Randy Crabtree, will represent Twiddy Insurance and Real Estate, their local sponsor, and the Albemarle area in the tournament.

Sponsored by the American Cancer Society, the tournament will take place at Bay Tree Plantation in north Myrtle Beach, S.C. The North Carolina and South Carolina state championships will take place simultaneously on the 54-hole course.

To qualify, the competitors first have to win their respective local tournaments. They then advance to the state finals and from there on to the national tournament, which

will be held sometime in December at Disneyworld, Florida.

Each tournament is divided into four divisions. They are the Men's Scratch Division, the Women's Scratch Division, the Men's Handicap Division, and the Women's Handicap Division.

Kelly, Bass, Bass, and Crabtree, who are in the Men's Scratch Division, have already won the local tournament in Elizabeth City and are now ready for state competition.

Rev. Thomas McPherson, pastor.

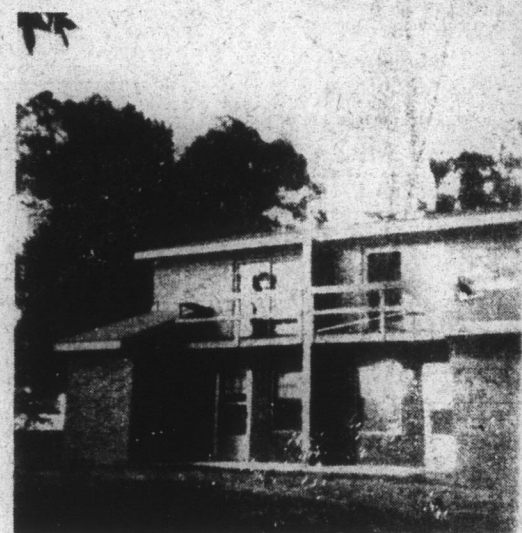

They may also register at the home of the Registrars or Judges or with any member of the Board of Elections by appointment ONLY.

Any person who has been a resident of Chowan County for 30 days is eligible to register and vote. He must be 18 years of age. Any person who has moved from one precinct to another must transfer to the precinct in which he now lives. Deadline for transfer is Monday, October 5th at 5:00 P.M.
