Miss Lane and Miss Underkofler gave reports of their activities and experiences at Girls State. Girls State was held in June at the University of N. C. at Greensboro, with over 300 girls from the state participating.

The purpose of Girls State is to provide citizenship training for girls of high school age, to afford them an opportunity to live together as self governing citizens, to inform them about the duties, privileges, rights and responsibilities of American citizenship, in order that they may understand and participate in the functioning of their government, and to help them grasp the meaning of some of the responsibilities which they must assume when they become adults.
