## Lt. Gov. Green **Guest Speaker** At Meeting

Lt. Gov. Jimmy Green called for the reduction of the size of state government through "normal attrition of our non-critical work force," at the annual meeting of the N. C. State Govern-Employees ment Association Saturday afternoon in Asheville.

"The millions we will save there can be used to fund fringe benefits and future salary increases for our hard-working career employees. State government has just simply gotten too large, and we cannot adequately provide for the employees we have now," Green said to the 13,000member group.

The Lt. Gov. reiterated his historically strong support for state employees, repeated that "rewarding our hardworking, productive career state employees is a top priority of mine."

Green said that neither he nor the legislators had all the answers, and called on the nearly 180,000 people employed by the state to help state officials solve the salary and fringe benefit funding problems.

"Who knows better than you how to cut waste, boost sagging worker morale, and reduce inefficiency? Who safe speed and fined \$25 fine knows better than you now to fairly compensate our best workers?" he asked.

Lt. Gov. Green also made the same comments Friday night at the N. C. State **Employees** Association **Annual Convention Banquet** in Winston-Salem.

The system's new Student Evaluation Policy has different promotionretention processes for students in three basic grade level categories as follows: K-8; 9-12; and exceptional children.

Promotion or detention of the K-8 student is based on a point system, with the minimum number of points for promotion being 12 out of a possible 29. Points for achievement are established at each grade level in eight criteria areas: Mastery of the basal reading text; reading percentile on standarized tests; in math mastery level); math percentile on standarized test, classroom performance as indicated by averaged grades, child's academic maturity, social maturity and physical maturity.
