-Placing more reliance on the market to solve energy problems, rather than on government controls. For example, although federal controls on domestic oil production ended in January, 1981, much of this country's natural gas production will continue under federal controls into the mid-1980s and beyond, unless existing laws are

-Reducing uncertainty and encouraging reasonable growth in nuclear power. -- Encouraging private development of a strong commercial synthetic fuels

industry. DiBona asserts that this country's prospects for solving its energy problems

are much brighter now than they were two or three years ago. He points out that some government policies already are changing and, most important, the market system is working to encourage more oil production.

"As a nation we have begun turning things around," he says, "but we will need to maintain our efforts persistently over the next several years in order to regain control of our energy future."




